About the Hon. Steve Bracks AC

Steve Bracks entered Parliament as the Member for Williamstown in 1994. After serving as a Shadow Minister in the Employment, Industrial Relations and Treasury portfolios, he became Leader of the State Opposition early in 1999. Mr Bracks fought the Election later that year with a completely new set of policies he oversaw and personally drafted in Opposition.

He went on to win the Election and became Victoria's 44th Premier. Steve Bracks became one of Victoria's most successful Premiers winning three consecutive elections including achieving record majorities in the 2002 and 2006 elections.

Mr Bracks holds a number of positions and in 2010 was the Honorary Chair of the Organising Committee for the World Road Cycling Championships held in Victoria.
